

RPI TV – Business Meeting

Meeting started at 8:36 PM.

Michael Rahaim said we need people for the ROTC drill meet this Saturday. Andrew Clark said he would be the supervisor, but we still need one person.

Huxley Seidman said it would be from 7:45 AM to 10:00 AM and from 1:20 PM to 3:20 PM, so the whole middle of the day is free.
