

RPI TV – Business Meeting
Monday, October 10, 2005
Union room 3602

Officers present: Andrew Clark, Michael Rahaim, Nick Wood, Eric Pratt
Members present: Christine Skrzypiec, Tony Furtado, Marc Ebuña, James Canha, Alexander Quinn

Meeting started at 8:37 PM.

Michael Rahaim called the meeting to order.

Andrew Clark didn't want to make copies of the agenda, so Michael Rahaim called him lazy.

Eric Pratt explained how the football game filming last Saturday went. He said the rain was a problem, and that one of the power adapters doesn't work anymore, maybe because it got wet. Eric Pratt also said that we put all three cameras on the balcony, and it would have been a larger problem if one was on the ground.

Eric Pratt discussed how The World This Week filming earlier today went. He said we did three takes – in the first take, he messed up a bit and Christine Skrzypiec's audio feed was very low, in the second take, the teleprompter started going too fast so the anchors started laughing, and the third take went well. So we used three DVDs for that. Andrew Clark asked if that was the first time we needed three takes, and Eric Pratt said yes.

Andrew Clark said we were making 3 copies of the IED Panel, and he wants Eric Klauser here to talk about that.

Nick Wood asked how the senate meeting went, Andrew Clark said it was bad, because we got no recording, and the DVD recorder didn't record. Andrew Clark said he wanted Eric Klauser to go to the next senate meeting.

Andrew Clark said the NAACP dinner is going to net us about \$250. He said it was \$240 plus whatever the organizer wants for copies.

Michael Rahaim asked if we have enough crew for The World This Week for the next two weeks. Eric Pratt said we probably do, and four people present (Marc Ebuña, James Canha, Christine Skrzypiec, and Tony Furtado) plus the usual people (Rob Humphreys, Dan Ostrov) should be coming back.

Michael Rahaim moved on to Armenian Cultural Night on Thursday, October 20. Andrew Clark said he wasn't sure whether it was a one or two camera shoot.

Eric Pratt mentioned that Eleanor had taken the PD100 this morning when we got to the studio, because Andrew Clark's e-mail to her had said we just wanted it for the weekend, and since

Columbus Day wasn't an institute holiday, she must not have considered this Monday part of the weekend.

Michael Rahaim discussed possible ways to crew the Armenian Cultural Night with Andrew Clark. He said tentatively we would put down Dan Ostrov and Michael Rahaim. He asked if anyone else could do it, no one could.

Michael Rahaim said the next football game is a week from next Saturday, and that Alan Trojan and Michael Rahaim could do it. Marc Ebuña also volunteered, if he could do something inside. Michael Rahaim also mentioned the football game on November 5.

Michael Rahaim asked if we want to do the next hockey game, and Andrew Clark said no. He then asked Andrew Clark about Battle of the Bands, and Andrew Clark said that was mainly Mike Filippone's thing and that we'll need five people. He said it was on Saturday, October 22 at 8:00 PM. Andrew Clark explained that the way Mike Filippone does it is he records the audio on 24 channels, gets it from UPAC sound, records and edits it in post-production.

Eric Klauser called Eric Pratt and told him he was coming.

Michael Rahaim mentioned that Rory's show will have to be discussed with Sundhari Ganesan, and moved to open floor.

Tony Furtado asked who he could talk to about music and what he couldn't use. Andrew Clark explained that short clips are better, unless it's something really recognizable, and that you should keep it under 30 seconds. Eric Pratt said it's better if it's for critical commentary or parody. Tony Furtado asked how he would ask permission, Andrew Clark said ask the recording studio, but they'll probably say no.
