

RPI TV Meeting Minutes

2007 January 16

Meeting Began at 21:36.

First order of business: crew for Hockey game against Clarkson game this Friday (January 19).

Charlie Emala: Who can do it? Hold your hands up while I make a list.

Tony Furtado asked, Is this for Saturday? Brian Zaik said No, it's for Friday.

Charlie Emala took a list of available members. Brian Zaik could only make setup. Sean Andrese will do the scoreboard.

Chris Gearns and Gino Pellicano entered and were scorned by President Emeritus Andy Clark.

Andy Clark read the list of those who previously volunteered for the Big Red Freakout, the hockey game on Saturday. Joe Goullaud and Chris Gearns are only available for setup. Joe corrected that he will be available for the whole thing. Charlie Emala commented "Imgonnabethere" through a piece of bread. Party at Klauser's house. Andy Clark asked about Senate meetings. Brian Michalski will take care of them. Andy will help work it out.

Shows. Charlie Emala made a list of every show that he could remember us being involved in. Joe is trying to pull together the programming.

Tony Furtado explained difficulty in producing "The Mole." His crew abandoned him, and replacements must be found. However, he has done a lot of work, writing challenges, as well as working on graphics for the show. He also has agreements with the staff of several campus locations for filming. He is still concerned about finding a larger group of people to produce it; there is too much weight on his responsibilities. Joe Goullaud asked about the requirements of casting, and Tony Furtado responded that because it is an eight-episode program, it would likely last for at least eight weeks during a semester. Joe Goullaud made some recommendations. Marc Ebuña volunteered to host the show.

Charlie Emala wants an update on Doraj. Charlie Emala called Dan Ostrov, who is on paid internship with MTV. Charlie Emala, Eric Pratt, and Andy Clark all reached his voicemail. Eric Pratt does not think Doraj will ever be completed. Andy Clark is more optimistic about the show. While there has been a lot of work done already, its

completion will require more participation from the rest of the club while Dan Ostrov is away.

The producers of “What’s up RPI?”, which is the name of the new news show, say that there are five tapes all filled with footage. The introduction and one segment are entirely edited. There needs to be work done in the studio. Dan Falkenstrom would like to estimate that the show would be done by the end of February. The group resolved to look into recruiting additional people for everything.

JG and Mike Filippone believe that completing Troy Treasure is nearly impossible. Nobody else can think of any other shows, though there was some confusion over the name of the news show.

Eric Pratt remembers a show called Cracked Sash, but it is not still in production.

Charlie Emala said last semester we had donuts, and we had enough money to last to the end. Mike Filippone is donutted out. Charlie Emala suggested pizza. What’s up RPI? asked if we still should have food. Tony Furtado suggested Munchkins. It was generally agreed that Mike Filippone is overweight. Andy Clark suggested restarting the collection. Several members donated money to the cause.

Charles Emala asked that complaints be directed to Andy Clark or Eric Klauser. Andy Clark (“A master of language,” raves Brian Zaik) asked that anyone involved in the Big Red Freakout stay, and everyone else get the hell out.

The meeting was adjourned by Charlie Emala at 21:55.
