*Meeting Began at 21:40.*

Meeting's now started. It's making fun of Klauser time, says Charlie Emala. Marc Ebuña says Eric Klauser has a cell phone hanging out of his pocket. Charlie Emala says Eric Klauser's car looks lame.

Joe Goullaud said Wednesday Night Live went really well, mostly because the band was very good. Also, there were four cameras to shoot two musicians. Joe has submitted the tape and is about to schedule it for broadcast. He thinks that a live broadcast of Wednesday Night Live will possible be ready for the episode after next.

Charlie Emala reported on the website. He says Mike DiTore (currently occupied with the minutes) has let him know about a few individuals who are recorded as members on the website, but are not actually listed in the official club membership list. Also, several officers are working on reviewing the equipment policy and making sure that it is enforced and the club does a good job of keeping track of training.
